

California Proposition 65

California Proposition 65, officially known as the Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, became law in November 1986. Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians (and others doing business in the State of California) about significant exposures to chemicals that are known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm.

Proposition 65 requires warning labels on the products or their immediate packaging that may contain any of the 900 plus chemicals or ingredients that the California Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA) lists as carcinogen or reproductive toxicant.

To the best of ASI's knowledge, ASI's products, as manufactured and shipped by ASI, comply with the safe harbor NSRL and MADL limits of Proposition 65. This assessment is based on our current level of knowledge from all of our material and component suppliers.
